I was very proud to be part of the Nottinghamshire's Children in Care Council planning group as an existing care leaver, to deliver this key piece of work with other young people from across the East Midlands ensuring skills that we develop through our sub groups are used, such as planning and communication.

Everyone had a very important role to play in the conference, but my role specifically was to open the conference with the history of Myplace, followed by delivering the Pledge workshop later on in the day, it was an absolute honour.

The atmosphere in the room was amazing, the young people started to mix and relate to one another and then started discussing and exchanging ideas. I think the day was well thought out and the young people as well as their professionals who supported the young people were accommodated for. I loved the fact at every opportunity given to include the young people and they were able to take that opportunity to express themselves.

Each region gave a presentation and the young people used a variety of methods to deliver their own piece of work/project that they were involved in. The conference was an opportunity to share best practice but more importantly for young people to meet up and share their experiences of being in care.

Nottinghamshire's workshop, was to create a Regional Pledge, ensuring that what young people are saying is firstly, listened to but at the same time ensuring the priorities are met for young people which all regions can share and own and to have something that connects them across the region.

The input and feedback about the pledge was brill! And this is coming from a young person. I was so pleased and so excited to come together to deliver the pledge that we designed with input from other regions so I'm beaming with pride, and as a promise to young people we intend to take back the information to our Children In Care Council groups from across the regions to feedback what they think the priorities should be.
