

# **Update for foster carers - 26th March 2020**

I hope you are all well and coping with the current unparalleled lockdown situation we are all dealing with due to the Covid-19 virus. I appreciate all you do as foster carers, caring for some of our most vulnerable children in these concerning times, thank you.

We are following government guidance and consequently, most of our staff are now working from home. If your SSW is not in work, support is available through our duty arrangements and we have a duty team manager also available daily.

I am sure you will appreciate that we are following government guidance in limiting direct contact, even more so following the recent government announcement and are adapting our working practices accordingly, as follows:

- There should be no face to face contacts with children and families, unless the child protection risk is assessed as high (child is at risk of significant harm) and a face to face visit is seen as essential to safeguard children, young people and care leavers. Any decision to do a face to face contact should be agreed by team managers
- All meetings of any kind will be done virtually from now on. This includes strategy discussions, panels, reviews etc.

- Telephone contact should be maintained with children and families through skype, telephone, text, WhatsApp etc.
- Children and young people should be encouraged to use Mind of my Own where possible.

# **Support care**

We are endeavouring to continue with support care arrangements, where deemed appropriate on a 'case by case' basis, firstly checking if both households are free of the virus and/or underlying conditions to assess the situation first.

### Contact

Given the present clear message from government about the need to avoid gatherings with friends and family, social distancing and self-isolation, indirect contact should be facilitated rather than direct contact, such as Facetime/Skype or a telephone call.

If you are not happy with this advice, then please speak with your SSW, as the CSW may need to consider speaking with legal services, should children or parents not be amenable to agreeing with indirect contact.

# Questions

I understand that there will be questions that you may have, and these should be raised with your supervising social worker in the first instance relating to specific circumstances of the carer/child, as these are best dealt with as far as possible with the SSW/CSW. For more general issues about the

#### Foster carer reviews

Paper work for reviews will be sent out electronically and we would appreciate foster carers are completing and return them promptly. Our SSW and FSOs can provide support and paper copies can be posted if there is no electronic means to complete them.
