FAQS

What is the purpose of this event?

This on-campus event has been designed to give care experienced and estranged students a flavour of university life and explain why they might wish to consider attending university as an option for after they finish school or college. It will also address some of the misconceptions commonly held by students around affordability and access for care experienced students. Information will be specifically for care experienced students and will talk about university generally, not just NTU. It is also a chance for students to meet our current NTU students who have been in care and ask them any questions they might have.

Do students have to be committed to attending university or NTU?

No. Obviously we would love all students to be considering NTU for after they have finished school or college but this is a chance for any student to come along, look around the university, hear about the support which is available generally at universities and meet other care experienced young people. They do not have to be committed to attending university or NTU.

Will there be other students there who aren't care experienced?

No, this event is aimed at care experienced young people only.
